Police and Crime Plan - Toolkit for Partners

Overview

The Mayor of West Yorkshire Tracy Brabin has set out her strategic vision for policing for the next four years in her new Police and Crime Plan. It builds on the work delivered during the first plan, including the establishment of the Women's Safety Unit and the launch of the Vision Zero strategy. The official launch of the plan will be on Monday February 24th at Cloth Hall Court in Leeds.

West Yorkshire Combined Authority will continue to work closely with Community Safety Partnerships in Bradford, Calderdale, Kirklees, Leeds and Wakefield, alongside other partners and stakeholders, to deliver on shared priorities.

Key messages

- The Mayor of West Yorkshire Tracy Brabin has launched her new Police and Crime Plan, which sets out policing priorities over the next four years.
- With tackling serious violence placed right at the heart of the Mayor's Police and Crime Plan, it sets out how, together, we can build a safe, just, and inclusive West Yorkshire. The Mayor will work with partners to take a public health approach to serious violence, placing the emphasis on prevention.
- A cross-cutting theme of the new plan is an effective response to men and boys, by recognising victims and protecting those at risk of victimisation.
- Across our partnership, reducing vulnerability is a priority. We're working hard with partners, so the Criminal Justice System works for victims and witnesses and looking at various ways to reduce reoffending.
- Tackling violence against women and girls remains a key part of the Police and Crime Plan. The West Yorkshire Combined Authority, the county's Violence Reduction Partnership (VRP), and West Yorkshire Police, will continue to explore new and innovative ways to make a real difference through the Women's Safety Unit.

- The Plan has been created with a 'Child First' lens to ensure a focus on children and creating a justice system that treats 'children as children'. Work will be undertaken with young people to design intervention programmes, education, training, services and opportunities.
- In conjunction with the Police and Crime Plan, the West Yorkshire Youth Commission have also launched a campaign called <u>'I took a seat'</u> co-produced with our Violence Reduction Partnership. It chimes closely with key themes of the Plan and the issues raised by young people in the region.
